COUNCIL MEETING

MAY 23, 2022

(Please note these are draft minutes and may be amended by Council before final approval.)

The Carroll City Council met in regular session on this date at 5:15 p.m. in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 627 N Adams Street. Council Members present: Kyle Bauer, Misty Boes, Tom Bordenaro, LaVern Dirkx, JJ Schreck, and Carolyn Siemann. Absent: None. Mayor Mark Beardmore presided and City Attorney Dave Bruner was in attendance.

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The Pledge of Allegiance was led by the City Council. No Council action taken.

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It was moved by Bordenaro, seconded by Bauer, to approve the following items on the consent agenda: a) minutes of the May 9, 2022 Council meeting, as written; b) bills and claims in the amount of \$856,510.73; c) Licenses and Permits: Renewal of Class "E" Liquor License with Class "B" Wine Permit and Class "C" Beer Permit and Sunday Sales – *Casey's General Store* #3025, Renewal of Class "B" Beer Permit with Sunday Sales – *Pizza Hut*, and New Special Class "C" Liquor License with Sunday Sales – *Napoli's Italian Restaurant*; d) the Council appointment of Jean Ludwig to the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Advisory Board for a three-year term to expire May 31, 2025; and e) Resolution No. 22-44, Opposing Eliminating the Use of CDBG Funds for Housing Rehabilitation and Homebuyer Assistance. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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There were no oral requests or communication from the audience.

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It was moved by Dirkx, seconded by Bauer, to approve the second reading and waive the third reading of an ordinance Amending Provisions Pertaining to Building Sewer Connection Charges. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Siemann, seconded by Dirkx, to adopt said Ordinance No. 2203. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Schreck, seconded by Siemann, to approve Resolution No. 22-45, Contract with Wellmark for Group Health Insurance Coverage and Setting COBRA rates for FY 2023. Debbie Dean, Senior Benefit Consultant with Benefit Source, Inc., addressed Council on this issue. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Boes, seconded by Bauer, to approve Resolution No. 22-46, Contract with Delta Dental for Group Dental Insurance for FY 2023. Debbie Dean, Senior Benefit Consultant with Benefit Source, Inc., addressed Council on this issue. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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At 5:39 p.m. Mayor Beardmore opened a public hearing on the FY 2021/2022 Budget Amendment #2. Mayor Beardmore closed said public hearing at 5:40 p.m.

It was moved by Bauer, seconded by Schreck, to approve Resolution No. 22-47, Amending the Current Budget for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2022. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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At 5:41 p.m. Mayor Beardmore opened a public hearing on the annexation request from James A. Rezac and Amanda M. Rezac. Mayor Beardmore closed said public hearing at 5:46 p.m.

It was moved by Bauer, seconded by Schreck, to approve Resolution No. 22-48, Voluntary Annexation of Land Adjacent to the East Boundary of the City of Carroll, Including Land Without the Owner's Consent into the Corporate Limits of the City of Carroll. On roll call, all present voted aye. Abstain: Boes. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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At 5:48 p.m. Mayor Beardmore opened a public hearing on the Plans, Specifications, Form of Contract and Estimated Cost for the Carroll Recreation Center Building Improvements Project – 2021. Brad Rodenburg, RDG Planning & Design representative, and Leo Kasparbauer and Jean Ludwig, both Carroll residents, addressed Council on this issue. Mayor Beardmore closed said hearing at 5:57 p.m.

It was moved by Siemann, seconded by Boes, to approve Resolution No. 22-49, Adopting the Plans, Specifications, Form of Contract and Estimated Cost for the Carroll Recreation Center Building Improvements Project – 2021. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Siemann, seconded by Boes, to approve Resolution No. 22-50, Authorizing a Contract with GovHR in the amount of \$26,700 for a Classification and Compensation Study. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried. * * * * * * *

Council discussed an ordinance change to Chapter 69.08, subsection 44 from a request from a council member to restrict parking on Timberline Road near the connection to Main Street. No Council action taken.

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Council recessed at 6:35 p.m. Council reconvened at 6:43 p.m.

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Council discussed the Union Pacific Railroad Quiet Zone Study Investigation Update Final Report prepared by Bolton & Menk, Inc. James Leiding and Greg Broussard, engineers with Bolton & Menk, Inc. presented the report to Council. Adam Schweers, Carroll resident, addressed Council on this issue. No Council action taken.

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It was moved by Bauer, seconded by Schreck, to adjourn at 7:49 p.m. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

SUBJECT: Annual Property & Liability Insurance Renewal

The City's property, liability and worker's compensation insurance is due for renewal on July 1, 2022. Attached is a comparison of premiums for the upcoming year and the past two years. All coverage is through Mid-Iowa Insurance (ICAP and IMWCA).

The total cost is \$404,074 which is \$92,522 more than the previous year. There are a number of reasons for the increase in premium this year as discussed below:

- 1. Per information received from Mid-Iowa Insurance, ICAP rates the City's liability premium based upon the city's upcoming budgeted expenses and a five-year loss ratio. Typically, the city's budgeted expenses increase each year. In fact, the budgeted expenses increased about \$7.4M from the prior year. The main increase relates to more expenses for debt service, capital projects and enterprise (water, sewer and storm water) capital projects.
- 2. For the FY 2022 premiums, ICAP did not give their members a credit that had been given for many years. The credit was a way to pay back their members for good years of operations. However, the derecho that moved across the state on August 10, 2020, caused lots of damage to many cities. ICAP has decided not to give the credit again in FY 2023 as many claims were paid for repairs caused by the derecho.
- 3. Property insurance typically goes up each year as the building values are increased to help cover cost of construction inflation. This year building values were automatically increased 4% by ICAP where in prior years the values were only increased 2%.
- 4. Builder's risk insurance (annual amount) for the almost completed Street Maintenance Building has been included in this year's renewal information. Once the project is complete, the builder's risk coverage will be converted/adjusted to property liability coverage. Typically, liability coverage is cheaper than builder's risk coverage, so if needed, a credit could be refunded to the city for the conversion.
- 5. The worker's compensation premium increased for a number of reasons including an increase in the experience modification factor (mod factor) and less IMWCA discounts received. The mod factor is based upon many things including the number and severity of claims over the three preceding years. The City's mod factor did increase from 0.72 to 0.97 for this renewal. A

mod factor of 1.00 is considered average so a mod factor of 0.97 is still slightly lower than average. In fact, a mod factor of 0.72 was one of the lowest at IMWCA. Also, the amount of IMWCA discounts decreased \$9,000 from the prior year.

Beginning in FY 2022, Council did increase the liability limit from \$5 million to \$7 million. Staff recommendation is to continue with the \$7 million liability limit.

These insurance renewal premiums are more than the FY 2023 budget amount of \$370,372.00. The City can either use General Fund reserve balances to cover the difference or ask for taxes in FY 2024. These options will be evaluated when preparing the FY 2024 budget.

The premiums are due July 1. As in the past, we are requesting Council consideration and approval to pay the premiums on July 1, 2022 out of the FY 2022/2023 budget.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Council discussion and approval of the attached resolution approving contracts for property, liability and worker's compensation insurance coverage which includes payment of premiums on July 1, 2022 and appoint City Manager Mike Pogge-Weaver and City Clerk/Finance Director Laura Schaefer as contacts to act as liaisons between the City and ICAP.

WHEREAS, Chapter 17, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Carroll, Iowa, provides that all contracts made by the City be reduced to writing and approved by the City Council by resolution: and

WHEREAS, it is determined that the approval of contracts with Iowa Community Assurance Pool (ICAP) for liability and property insurance coverage and with Iowa Municipal Workers Compensation Association (IMWCA) for worker compensation insurance coverage effective July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023 is in the best interest of the City of Carroll, Iowa;

WHEREAS, City Manager Mike Pogge-Weaver is appointed as the primary contact and City Clerk/Finance Director Laura Schaefer is appointed as the alternate contact to act as liaisons between the City of Carroll and ICAP for purposes of relating risk reduction and loss control information, and any other loss information or instructions concerning the obligations of the City imposed by signing the Iowa Risk Management Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the contracts with Iowa Community Assurance Pool (ICAP) for liability and property insurance coverage and with Iowa Municipal Workers Compensation Association (IMWCA) for worker compensation insurance coverage be authorized and approved and appoint City Manager Mike Pogge-Weaver and City Clerk/Finance Director Laura Schaefer as contacts to act as liaisons between the City and ICAP.

The FY 2023 budget incorporates the issuance of tax-exempt general obligation capital loan notes to partially finance the Street Restoration -2022 Project. The intent is to issue this debt after July 1, 2022. The Street Restoration -2022 Project is anticipated to be completed by November 15, 2022. The intent is to reimburse some of the previously paid project expenditures with debt proceeds when the debt is issued in FY 2023.

In order to be in compliance with IRS regulations and use tax-exempt debt proceeds to reimburse the City for the above-mentioned expenditures, Council would need to declare an official intent. Attached is a resolution declaring that official intent. To be effective, it must be adopted within 60 days after the funding of an expenditure that is expected to be reimbursed from the note issuance. It should be noted that architectural, engineering, and survey costs, which do not exceed 20% of the issuance amount, are not subject to the reimbursement rules meaning they can be reimbursed with bond proceeds even if they were originally paid longer than 60 days before adopting the reimbursement resolution.

RECOMMENDATION: Council approval of the attached resolution declaring an official intent under Treasury Regulation 1.150-2 to issue debt to reimburse the City for certain original expenditures paid in connection with the Street Restoration – 2022 Project.

RESOLUTION DECLARING AN OFFICIAL INTENT UNDER TREASURY REGULATION 1.150-2 TO ISSUE DEBT TO REIMBURSE THE CITY FOR CERTAIN ORIGINAL EXPENDITURES PAID IN CONNECTION WITH SPECIFIED PROJECTS

WHEREAS, the City anticipates making cash expenditures for one or more capital improvement projects, generally described below (each of which shall hereinafter be referred to as a "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the City reasonably expects to issue debt to reimburse the costs of a Project; and

WHEREAS, the Council believes it is consistent with the City's budgetary and financial circumstances to issue this declaration of official intent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CARROLL, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. That this Resolution be and does hereby serve as a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.

Section 2. That it is reasonably expected that capital expenditures will be made in respect of the following Project(s), from time to time and in such amounts as this Council determines to be necessary or desirable under the circumstances then and there existing.

Section 3. That the City reasonably expects to reimburse all or a portion of the following expenditures with the proceeds of bonds, notes or other indebtedness to be issued or incurred by the City in the future.

Section 4. That the total estimated costs of the Project(s), the maximum principal amount of the bonds, notes or other indebtedness to be issued for the foregoing Project(s) and the estimated dates of completion of the Project(s) are reasonably expected to be as follows:

Kendra Reich, property owner of 1027 N Carroll Street, has requested a hearing with the Council as to whether a nuisance exists in accordance with Chapter 50 and 51 of the City code.

At the time of the hearing, evidence will be presented.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Based upon evidence presented, Council discussion and determination if a nuisance exists at 1027 N Carroll Street.

CHAPTER 50

NUISANCE ABATEMENT PROCEDURE

- 50.01 Definitions
- 50.02 Nuisances Enumerated
- 50.03 Other Conditions
- 50.04 Building Maintenance
- 50.05 Household Goods and Machinery
- 50.06 Construction Equipment and Materials

50.01 DEFINITIONS.

For use in this chapter, the following terms are defined:

1. "Junk" is defined in Section 51.01(1) of this Code of Ordinances.

2. "Junk vehicle" is defined in Section 51.01(2) of this Code of Ordinances.

3. "Motor vehicle" is defined in Chapter 321 of the Code of Iowa, including motorized bicycles, motorcycles, and all terrain vehicles.

4. "Nuisance" means whatever is injurious to health, indecent, or unreasonably offensive to the senses, or an obstruction to the free use of property so as essentially to interfere unreasonably with the comfortable enjoyment of life or property is a nuisance.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 657.1)

5. "Vehicle" is defined in Section 51.01(3).

50.02 NUISANCES ENUMERATED.

The following subsections include, but do not limit, the conditions that are deemed to be nuisances in the City:

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 657.2)

1. Offensive Smells. Erecting, continuing, or using any building or other place for the exercise of any trade, employment, or manufacture that, by occasioning noxious exhalations, unreasonably offensive smells, or other annoyances, becomes injurious and dangerous to the health, comfort, or property of individuals or the public.

2. Filth or Noisome Substance. Causing or suffering any offal, filth, or noisome substance to be collected or to remain in any place to the prejudice of others.

3. Impeding Passage of Navigable River. Obstructing or impeding without legal authority the passage of any navigable river, harbor, or collection of water.

4. Water Pollution. Corrupting or rendering unwholesome or impure the water of any river, stream, or pond, or unlawfully diverting the same from its natural course or state, to the injury or prejudice of others.

5. Blocking Public and Private Ways. Obstructing or encumbering, by fences, buildings or otherwise, the public roads, private ways, streets, alleys, commons, landing places, or burying grounds.

6. Houses of Ill Fame. Houses of ill fame, kept for the purpose of prostitution and lewdness; gambling houses; places resorted to by persons participating in criminal gang activity prohibited by Chapter 723A of the *Code of Iowa* or places resorted to by persons using controlled substances, as defined in Section 124.101 of the *Code of Iowa*, in violation of law, or houses where drunkenness, quarreling, fighting or breaches of the peace are carried on or permitted to the disturbance of others.

7. Billboards. Billboards, signboards, and advertising signs, whether erected and constructed on public or private property, that so obstruct and impair the view of any portion or part of a public street, avenue, highway, boulevard or alley or of a railroad or street railway track as to render dangerous the use thereof. (See also Section 62.04.)

8. Storing of Flammable Junk. Depositing or storing of flammable junk, such as old rags, rope, cordage, rubber, bones and paper, by dealers in such articles within the fire limits of the City, unless in a building of fireproof construction. (See also Chapter 51.)

9. Grasses, Weeds, and Brush. Dense growth of all weeds, vines, brush, or other vegetation in the City so as to constitute a health, safety, or fire hazard. Grasses and weeds that are allowed to grow on any developed lot to a height greater than eight (8) inches, grasses and weeds that are allowed to grow on any undeveloped lot to a height greater than twelve (12) inches, and any growth of noxious weeds as defined in the *Code of Iowa*. This subsection does not apply to grasses grown as agricultural crops on undeveloped property or to grasses growing in an area declared by the Council to be a natural woodlands area.

10. Dutch Elm Disease. Trees infected with Dutch elm disease. (See also Chapter 151.)

11. Vermin Harborage. Conditions that are conducive to the harborage or breeding of vermin.

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12. Dilapidated Buildings. Any building or structure that is in such a dilapidated condition that it is unfit for human habitation, or kept in such an unsafe or unsanitary condition that it is a menace to the health of people residing in the vicinity thereof, or any building or structure defined as a dangerous or unsafe building in Chapter 145 of this Code of Ordinances.

50.03 OTHER CONDITIONS.

The following chapters of this Code of Ordinances contain regulations prohibiting or restricting other conditions that are deemed to be nuisances:

- 1. Junk and Junk Vehicles (See Chapter 51)
- 2. Dangerous Buildings (See Chapter 145)
- 3. Storage and Disposal of Solid Waste (See Chapter 105)
- 4. Trees (See Chapter 151)

50.04 BUILDING MAINTENANCE.

Every building shall be maintained to be free from excessively peeling paint or other conditions suggestive of deterioration or inadequate maintenance. Exterior surfaces shall not have any holes or broken glass; loose, cracked or damaged shingles or siding; or other defects in the exterior finish which admit rain, cold air, dampness, rodents, insects, or vermin. Basements, cellars, and crawl spaces shall be free of standing water and hazards. All wood, including floorboards, subfloors, joists, bridging, roof rafters and sheathing, and all other wood in any interior or exterior floor, wall, roof, or other part of the structure shall be maintained to be free of cracks affecting structural integrity, termite damage, infestation, or rot. Any and all damaged or deteriorating materials shall be replaced. If infestation exists in any basement, cellar, or crawl space, such infestation shall be remedied in accordance with industry standards. Violation of this section is declared to be a nuisance.

50.05 HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND MACHINERY.

No furniture, household furnishings, appliances, or other such items not designed for outside use and no machinery, implements, or other such equipment that is in inoperable condition, including component parts thereof, shall be stored or kept outside for a period of more than twenty-four (24) hours on any premises in a residential area. Violation of this section is declared to be a nuisance.

50.06 CONSTRUCTION EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS.

Operable machinery, equipment, and materials being used for construction purposes, including pipes, lumber, forms, dirt, sand, and sod, shall not be stored or kept in the open, except:

1. For use in the ordinary course of business as the inventory or asset of a contractor, supplier, or government subdivision; or

2. On the job site of a project in progress, for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days after construction has been completed or a separate certificate of occupancy has been issued, whichever occurs first.

Violation of this section is declared to be a nuisance.

50.07 JUNK AND JUNK VEHICLES.

It is hereby declared that storage within the corporate limits of any junk or a junk vehicle upon private property owned or controlled by the owner of the junk or junk vehicle, unless excepted by Section 51.04 of this Code of Ordinances, constitutes a threat to the health and safety of the citizens and is a nuisance within the meaning of Section 657.1 of the *Code of Iowa*. If any junk or junk vehicle is stored upon private property in violation hereof, the owner or person in control of the property upon which it is stored shall be *prima facie* liable for said violation.

50.08 NUISANCES PROHIBITED.

The creation or maintenance of a nuisance is prohibited, and a nuisance, public or private, may be abated in the manner provided for in this chapter or Chapter 657 of the *Code of Iowa*.

50.09 NUISANCE ABATEMENT.

Whenever any authorized municipal officer finds that a nuisance exists, such officer has the authority to determine on a case-by-case basis whether to utilize the nuisance abatement procedure described in Section 50.10 of this chapter or the municipal infraction procedure referred to in Section 50.11.

50.10 ABATEMENT OF NUISANCE BY WRITTEN NOTICE.

Any nuisance, public or private, may be abated in the manner provided for in this section:

1. Contents of Notice to Property Owner. The notice to abate shall contain: $^{\dagger 2}$

- A. Description of Nuisance. A description of what constitutes the nuisance.
- B. Location of Nuisance. The location of the nuisance.
- C. Acts Necessary to Abate. A statement of the act or acts necessary to abate the nuisance.
- D. Reasonable Time. A reasonable time within which to complete the abatement.

E. Assessment of City Costs. A statement that if the nuisance or condition is not abated as directed and no request for hearing is made within the time prescribed, the City will abate it and assess the costs against the property owner.

2. Method of Service. The notice may be in the form of an ordinance or sent by certified mail to the property owner.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.12[3h])

3. Request for Hearing. Any person ordered to abate a nuisance may have a hearing with the Council as to whether a nuisance exists. A request for a hearing must be made in writing and delivered to the Clerk within the time stated in the notice, or it will be conclusively presumed that a nuisance exists and it must be abated as ordered. The hearing will be before the Council at a time and place fixed by the Council. The findings of the Council shall be conclusive and, if a nuisance is found to exist, it shall be ordered abated within a reasonable time under the circumstances.

4. Abatement in Emergency. If it is determined that an emergency exists by reason of the continuing maintenance of the nuisance or condition, the City may perform any action that may be required under this chapter without prior notice. The City shall assess the costs as provided in subsection 6 of this section after notice to the property owner under the applicable provisions of subsection 1 and 2, and the hearing as provided in subsection 3.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.12[3h])

5. Abatement by City. If the person notified to abate a nuisance or condition neglects or fails to abate as directed, the City may perform the required action to abate, keeping an accurate account of the expense incurred. The itemized expense account shall be filed with the Clerk, who shall pay such expenses on behalf of the City.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.12[3h])

6. Collection of Costs. The Clerk shall send a statement of the total expense incurred by certified mail to the property owner who has failed to abide by the notice to abate, and if the amount shown by the statement has not been paid within one month, the Clerk shall certify the costs to the County Treasurer and such costs shall then be collected with, and in the same manner as, general property taxes.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.12[3h])

7. Installment Payment of Cost of Abatement. If the amount expended to abate the nuisance or condition exceeds one hundred dollars (\$100.00), the City may permit the assessment to be paid in up to ten (10) annual installments, to be paid in the same manner and with the same interest rates provided for assessments against benefited property under State law.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.13)

8. Failure to Abate. Any person causing or maintaining a nuisance who shall fail or refuse to abate or remove the same within the reasonable time required and specified in the notice to abate is in violation of this Code of Ordinances.

Notes

² [†]EDITOR'S NOTE: A suggested form of notice for the abatement of nuisances is included in the Appendix of this Code of Ordinances. Caution is urged in the use of this administrative abatement procedure, particularly where cost of abatement is more than minimal or where there is doubt as to whether or not a nuisance does in fact exist. If compliance is not secured following notice and hearings, we recommend you review the situation with your attorney before proceeding with abatement and assessment of costs. Your attorney may recommend proceedings in court under Chapter 657 of the *Code of Iowa* rather than this procedure.

50.11 MUNICIPAL INFRACTION ABATEMENT PROCEDURE.

In lieu of the abatement procedures set forth in Section 50.10, the requirements of this chapter may be enforced under the procedures applicable to municipal infractions as set forth in Chapter 4 of this Code of Ordinances.

JUNK AND JUNK VEHICLES

51.01 Definitions

51.04 Exceptions 51.05 Other Exceptions 51.06 Notice to Abate

51.01 DEFINITIONS.

For use in this chapter, the following terms are defined:

51.02 Junk and Junk Vehicles Prohibited

51.03 Junk and Junk Vehicles a Nuisance

1. "Junk" means all old or scrap copper, brass, lead, or any other non-ferrous metal; old or discarded rope, rags, batteries, paper, trash, rubber, debris, waste or used lumber, or salvaged wood; dismantled vehicles, machinery and appliances or parts of such vehicles, machinery or appliances; iron, steel or other old or scrap ferrous materials; old or discarded glass, tinware, plastic or old or discarded household goods or hardware. Neatly stacked firewood located on a side yard or a rear yard is not considered junk.

2. "Junk vehicle" means any vehicle licensed, unlicensed or legally placed in storage with the County Treasurer, stored within the corporate limits of the City and which has any of the following characteristics:

A. Habitat for Nuisance Animals or Insects. Any vehicle which has become the habitat for rats, mice, or snakes, or any other vermin or insects.

B. Flammable Fuel. Any unlicensed vehicle which contains gasoline or any other flammable fuel.

C. Inoperable. Any motor vehicle, if it lacks an engine or two or more wheels or other structural parts which render said motor vehicle unfit for legal use, or which cannot be immediately started and moved under its own power, as demonstrated by the owner to the police officer.

D. Unsafe and/or Unattended. Any vehicle left unattended up on blocks, jacks or elevated in any other way which constitutes a threat to the public health or safety. Any vehicle that has any broken glass or broken or loose parts, which individually or collectively make the vehicle unsafe or unfit for legal use or which otherwise constitutes a threat to public health or safety.

E. Storage. Any vehicle used as storage for items such as rags, old rope, batteries, paper, trash bags, machinery, mechanical parts, scrap housing goods, dead plant material or any similar material.

F. Defective or Obsolete Condition. Any other vehicle which, because of its defective or obsolete condition, in any other way constitutes a threat to the public health and safety.

Mere licensing of such vehicle shall not constitute a defense to the finding that the vehicle is a junk vehicle.

3. "Vehicle" means every device in, upon, or by which a person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway or street, excepting devices moved by human power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks, and includes without limitation a motor vehicle, automobile, truck, motorcycle, motor home, camper, tractor, buggy, wagon, farm machinery, or any combination thereof.

4. "Property" means either private or public real property within the City.

5. "Unlicensed" means any vehicle which is not displaying a valid current registration plate(s) as required by the laws of the State.

6. "Structure" means fully enclosed building that does not allow the contents to be viewed from the outside (excluding windows). A structure does not include a carport, car cover or tarp.

51.02 JUNK AND JUNK VEHICLES PROHIBITED.

It is unlawful for any person to store, accumulate, or allow to remain on any private property within the corporate limits of the City any junk or junk vehicle.

51.03 JUNK AND JUNK VEHICLES A NUISANCE.

It is hereby declared that any junk or junk vehicle located upon private property, unless excepted by Section 51.04, constitutes a threat to the health and safety of the citizens and is a nuisance within the meaning of Section 657.1 of the *Code of Iowa*. If any junk or junk vehicle is kept upon private property in violation hereof, the owner of or person occupying the property upon which it is located shall be prima facie liable for said violation.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.12[3a])

51.04 EXCEPTIONS.

The provisions of this chapter do not apply to any junk or a junk vehicle stored within a:

1. Structure. A garage or other enclosed structure;

2. Salvage Yard. An auto salvage yard or junk yard lawfully operated within the City; or

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3. Lawful Business. Any lawful business within a properly zoned area, wherein the junk or junk vehicle(s) are necessary to carry out the primary function of the business. This would not include junk or junk vehicles that have not been used for excessive periods of time.

51.05 OTHER EXCEPTIONS.

1. Race Cars. Vehicles used for racing, if they are under a fitted car cover and parked on a concrete, asphalt, or rock/gravel parking area. Parking on grass or other areas of the property would be acceptable if the area is enclosed by a privacy fence of at least six feet.

2. Vehicles Being Restored and Parts Cars. Such vehicles are acceptable if they are under a fitted car cover and parked on a concrete, asphalt, or rock/gravel parking area. Parking on grass or other areas of the property would be acceptable if the area is enclosed by a privacy fence of at least six feet. Vehicles being restored must be completed within one year to qualify for this exception unless an extension is granted by the Police Chief following a showing of proof that significant progress has been made toward the restoration. Parts cars will only qualify for this exception during the actual restoration of the primary vehicle or during any granted extensions.

3. The Police Chief may grant other exceptions in his or her discretion as long as these exceptions meet the primary intent of this chapter. Any such exceptions will be in writing and for a specific period of time.

51.06 NOTICE TO ABATE.

Upon discovery of any junk or junk vehicle located upon private property in violation of Section 51.03, the City shall within five (5) days initiate abatement procedures as outlined in Chapter 50 of this Code of Ordinances.

The legal description of the property is: A part of the NE1/4 NW1/4 of Section 29, Township 84 North, Range 34 West 5th P.M., Carroll County, Iowa, described viz: Beginning at a point 377.5 feet west of the northeast corner of the said NE1/4 NW1/4; thence south 241.7 feet; thence due west 208.7 feet; thence

north 241.7 feet to a point on the north line of said Section 29; thence east along said Section line 208.7 feet to the point of beginning, EXCEPTING therefrom that part previously deeded to the State of Iowa for highway purposes. And Lot four (4) of the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section Twenty-nine (29), Township Eighty-four (84) North, Range Thirty-four (34) West, 5th P.M., Carroll County, Iowa. No one was present to represent the applicant. No comments from the public, written or verbal, were presented and no one present opposed. SUBJECT: Corridor of Commerce Downtown Streetscape Phase 11

The Corridor of Commerce Masterplan was completed in 2003. The Masterplan primarily focused on a corridor along U.S. Highway 30 from Kittyhawk Avenue on the west to Olympic Avenue (CH N33) on the east. Within the corridor, two zones were identified as follows:

Heart of Downtown Zone: Bounded generally by West Street on the west, Clark Street on the east, 4th Street on the south and 7th Street on the north.

Corridor Zone: U.S. Highway 30 from Kittyhawk Avenue to West Street and from Clark Street to Olympic Avenue (CH N33).

The Zones are illustrated on the attached Concept Plan.

Subsequent to the Masterplan, the Corridor Zone was reduced to U.S. Highway 71 to West Street and Clark Street to Grant Road. The locations are depicted on the attached Confluence Exhibit.

For the purposes of funding and construction, the project was further divided into phases. The Heart of Downtown Zone construction included Phases 1 - 10. Construction on Phase 1 was completed in 2004 and construction on Phase 10 was substantially completed in 2021.

Phase 11 is the reduced Corridor Zone: U.S. Highway 30 from U.S. Highway 71 to West Street and Clark Street to Grant Road. The preliminary estimated construction cost of Phase II is \$1,600,000. Construction is anticipated to be in 2023.

Design of Phase 11 was initiated with Confluence on October 22, 2018. Design work has currently been suspended pending Mayor and City Council review of the project.

A Confluence representative will attend the June 13 City Council Meeting to conduct a work session providing the Mayor and City Council additional information on Phase II.

Gateway zone: Entrance to the City



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
