Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, office paper, cereal type boxes, junk mail, and clean, dry and wearable clothing

Can be mixed together and must be bagged or bundled and put on the top of the container.

All clean glass jars and bottles, aluminum cans, steel cans, and plastic containers.

Can be mixed together and placed on the bottom of the recycling container.

Made Into

New glass

jars and bottles

wine glasses

kitchen countertops

Flatten corrugated cardboard and place underneath recycling container.

GLASS JARS & BOTTLES



All food and beverage jars and bottles (including all colors of glass). Examples: soft drink, juice, beer/wine bottles, spaghetti sauce, baby food, pickle, and mayonnaise jars.

- Empty and rinse jars and bottles.
- Lids and labels are okay.
- Food and beverage containers only.

Ø

Mirrors, window glass, drinking glass, plates, pottery, ceramics, and light bulbs are <u>NOT</u> recyclable.

New cans

CANS



All aluminum foil containers, tin food and beverage cans. Examples: aluminum or crumpled foil, foil pie plates, juice cans, canned fruit and vegetable cans.

- Empty and rinse cans.
- Lids and labels are okay.



Furniture, furnace filters, metal pots and pans, kitchen appliances, and aluminum siding are <u>NOT</u> recyclable.

PLASTIC CONTAINERS



All clear and colored plastic containers with a through recycling symbol. Look on the bottom of the bottle for the number 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Examples: Milk jugs, soft drink and juice bottles, detergent and bleach bottles.

- Empty and rinse plastic containers.
- Lids and labels are okay. Flatten jugs.
- If there is no number, throw away the container.

Ø

Plastic bags, styrofoam products, toys, flower pots, waste baskets, laundry baskets or Tupperware type products are <u>NOT</u> recyclable.

4' x 8' sheets of plastic lumber, blankets, bird feeders, t-shirts, sweatshirts, picnic tables, park benches and playground equipment.

• ALL glass jars and bottles, cans and plastic jugs can be mixed in the bottom of your recycling bin. Do not put these containers in separate plastic bags. All these materials must be clean.

Put In Bin Accepted Made Into

NEWSPAPERS, OFFICE PAPER, MAGAZINES, CATALOGS, AND BOXBOARD



Newspapers (including all inserts), phone books, junk mail, magazines, catalogs, office paper and boxboard containers (cereal boxes, gift boxes, shoe boxes)

- Remove all plastic liners and paper from boxboard containers and <u>flatten the boxes</u>.
- All the above paper products may be mixed and <u>must</u> be bagged or bundled.
- Place bagged or bundled paper products on top of or beside your recycling bin.
- Do <u>not</u> place paper products loose in your recycling bin or mix with your glass, cans or plastic containers.



Hardcover books, fax paper, wax paper, tissue paper, wood products and kitty litter are <u>NOT</u> recyclable.

New newspapers, magazines, office paper, other grades of paper, and insulation

CARDBOARD



Corrugated cardboard boxes - the type of cardboard with two layers of paper surrounding an inner layer of fluted/ wavy paper.

- Remove all contents and flatten boxes.
- Place cardboard bundle beside or underneath your recycling bin.

New cardboard boxes



Waxed cardboard, milk cartons, pizza boxes and dirty cardboard boxes are <u>NOT</u> recyclable.

CLOTHING



Clean, dry, and wearable clothing.

- Do not remove buttons or zippers.
- Can be mixed with bagged/bundled paper products.

Sent to third world countries where it is worn.



Dirty clothing, carpets, rags, rugs, and curtains are <u>NOT</u> recyclable.

It is very important that every resident in the area recycle the right way. Rinse containers. Please do not mix paper products with your containers. Don't waste your time and effort...Do it right!!
