Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, office paper, cereal boxes, junk mail and beer and pop boxes.





Can be mixed together and must be bagged or bundled and put on the top of the container.

All clean glass jars and bottles, aluminum cans, steel cans, and plastic containers.



Can be mixed together and placed on the bottom of the recycling container.

Flatten corrugated cardboard and place underneath recycling container.

ALL glass jars and bottles, cans, and plastic jugs can be mixed in the bottom of your recycling bin. Do not put these containers in separate plastic bags. All these materials must be clean.

PUT IN BIN	ACCEPTED
<p>GLASS JARS & BOTTLES</p> 	<p>All food and beverage jars and bottles (including all colors of glass). Examples: all glass bottles and jars that come with food or drinks.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Empty and rinse jars and bottles.</u> • Lids and labels are okay. • Food and beverage containers only.
<p>STEEL CANS</p> 	<p>All aluminum foil containers, steel food and beverage cans. Examples: aluminum or crumpled foil, foil pie plates, juice cans, canned fruit, and vegetable cans</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Empty and rinse jars and bottles.</u> • Lids are okay.
<p>PLASTIC CONTAINERS</p> 	<p>All clear and colored plastic containers with a  through  recycling symbol. Plastic #3 - #7 with a screw top lid. Examples: Milk jugs, soft drink and juice bottles, water bottles, yogurt and butter containers, detergent and bleach bottles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Empty and rinse jars and bottles.</u> • Lids and labels are okay. Flatten jugs. • If there is no number, throw away the container.

NON - ACCEPTABLE LIST ON BACK

PUT IN BIN	ACCEPTED
<p>NEWSPAPERS, OFFICE PAPER, MAGAZINES, CATALOGS, AND CEREAL BOXES</p> 	<p>Newspapers (including all inserts), phone books, junk mail, magazines, brown grocery bags, catalogs, office paper, cereal boxes, gift boxes, shoe boxes, beer and pop boxes, and shredded paper.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remove all plastic liners and paper from boxes and <u>flatten the boxes</u>. • All the above paper products may be mixed and <u>must</u> be bagged or bundled. • Place bagged or bundled paper products on top of or beside your recycling bin. • Do not place paper products loose in your recycling bin or mix with your glass, cans or plastic containers.
<p>CARDBOARD</p> 	<p>Corrugated cardboard boxes - the type of cardboard with two layers of paper surrounding an inner layer or fluted/wavy paper.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remove all contents and flatten boxes. • Place cardboard bundle beside or underneath your recycling bin.
