COUNCIL MEETING

FEBRUARY 14, 2022

(Please note these are draft minutes and may be amended by Council before final approval.)

The meeting was held in-person, telephonically or via Zoom web conferencing for those individuals who wished to attend remotely. The public was able to hear and participate in the Council meeting by calling into a publicly posted phone number.

The Carroll City Council met in regular session on this date at 5:15 p.m. in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 627 N Adams Street. Council Members present: Kyle Bauer, Misty Boes, Tom Bordenaro, LaVern Dirkx, JJ Schreck, and Carolyn Siemann. Absent: None. Mayor Mark Beardmore presided and City Attorney Dave Bruner was in attendance.

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The Pledge of Allegiance was led by the City Council. No Council action taken.

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It was moved by Dirkx, seconded by Schreck, to approve the following items on the consent agenda: a) minutes of the January 24, January 31, February 2 and February 7, 2022 Council meetings, as written; b) bills and claims in the amount of \$886,474.15; c) Renewal of Class "C" Beer Permit with Class "B" Wine Permit and Sunday Sales – *Dollar General Store* #2756, Renewal of Class "E" Liquor License with Class "B" Wine Permit and Class "C" Beer Permit and Sunday Sales – *Wal-Mart Super Center #1787*, and New Class "C" Liquor License (8 month) with Outdoor Service and Sunday Sales – *Golf Services, LLC*; d) appointment of Richard Boes to the Planning and Zoning Commission to fill an open position for a term to expire December 31, 2025; and e) the appointments of Jason Gray and Colby Baumhover to begin duties as members of the Carroll Volunteer Fire Department. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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There were no oral requests or communication from the audience.

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Mayor Beardmore read a proclamation proclaiming February 4, 2022 as World Cancer Day in Carroll, Iowa and urged every member of the community to put forth their expressions of gratitude and applauded the past, present and future cancer patients and the health care workers who serve them. No Council action taken.

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It was moved by Dirkx, seconded by Boes, to approve Resolution No. 22-02, City-County Amended Precinct Agreement for the 2021 Redistricting Process. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

Council Member Dirkx introduced an ordinance to amend provisions pertaining to Voting Precinct 1. It was moved by Dirkx, seconded by Bauer, to approve the first reading of said ordinance. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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At 5:23 p.m. Mayor Beardmore opened a public hearing on the vacation of three plats of survey owned by Leona M. Drees Farm, LLC in the NE1/4 of Section 12, Township 84 North, Range 35 West 5th P.M, Carroll County, Iowa. Mayor Beardmore closed said hearing at 5:26 p.m.

It was moved by Boes, seconded by Bauer, to approve Resolution 22-03, Vacation of Three Plats of Survey owned by Leona M. Drees Farm, LLC in the NE1/4 of Section 12, Township 84 North, Range 35 West 5th P.M, Carroll County, Iowa. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Siemann, seconded by Boes, to approve Resolution 22-04, Committing Funds for Construction and Assuring Operation and Maintenance of the Twelfth Street Reconstruction Project. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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Council received the report of bid opening for the Carroll Recreation Center Building Improvement Project – 2021. Vicki Gach, Randy Toft, Mary Bruner, Ann Fitzpatrick, Al Short, Ryan Gallegos, Jeff Scharfenkamp, Jean Guy, Renee Brincks, Kim Tiefenthaler, Adam Schweers, and Jeff Cayler addressed Council on this issue.

It was moved by Siemann, seconded by Dirkx, to approve a resolution to award a construction contract to Badding Construction for the base bid and alternate 1 in the amount of \$7,935,000.00. On roll call, ayes: Boes, Dirkx and Siemann; nays: Bauer, Bordenaro and Schreck. Absent: None. Motion failed.

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Council recessed at 7:12 p.m. Council reconvened at 7:30 p.m.

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Council discussed the pre-levy resolution process for the proposed FY 2023 debt issuance. No Council action taken.

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It was moved by Bordenaro, seconded Bauer, to rebid HVAC, locker rooms, wet classroom and corridor renovations for the Carroll Recreation Center Improvement Project – 2021. Al Short and Renee Brincks addressed Council on this issue. On roll call, ayes: Bauer, Bordenaro and Schreck; nays: Boes, Dirkx and Siemann. Absent: None. Motion failed.

It was moved by Siemann, seconded by Dirkx, to approve a resolution to award a construction contract to Badding Construction for the base bid and alternate 1 and to value engineer the project to find cost savings. On roll call, ayes: Boes, Dirkx and Siemann; nays: Bauer, Bordenaro and Schreck. Absent: None. Motion failed.

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It was moved by Dirkx, seconded by Schreck, to set Monday, February 28, 2022, as the date for a public hearing for the proposed property tax levy of \$5,655,712 for a tax rate of \$10.74226. Renee Brincks addressed Council on this issue. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Bauer, seconded by Dirkx, to waive Purchasing Policy No. 0501 and approve the purchase of a Heavy Duty Truck with body and plow equipment from O'Halloran International at their quoted net price of \$168,647.25 plus additional surcharges that may apply. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Bauer, seconded by Bordenaro, to accept the bid from Western Iowa Tree Service for the removal of a total of 50 trees in the Golf Course and Parks at their bid price of \$24,750.00, and to accept the bid from Eddy's Limbs for the removal of 17 trees in the Cemetery at their bid price of \$18,400.00. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Schreck, seconded by Dirkx, to accept the bid from Van Wall Equipment for the purchase of a 60" front mount mower with cab and blower for the Cemetery at their bid price of \$24,910.76. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Bauer, seconded by Dirkx, to waive Purchasing Policy No. 0501 and approve the purchase of two Expresso Upright Series Bikes from Nova Fitness Equipment at the

quoted purchase price of \$12,632.48. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion
carried.
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It was moved by Bauer, seconded by Bordenaro, to adjourn at 8:36 p.m. On roll call, all

THIRD AMENDMENT TO WATER TOWER ATTACHMENT OPTION AND LEASE AGREEMENT

This Amendment Number 3 to Water Tower Attachment and Lease Agreement ("Third Amendment") made this _____ day of _______, (Effective Date) modifies that certain Water Tower Attachment Option and Lease Agreement ("Agreement") dated November 12, 2001, between SprintCom LLC, a Kansas limited liability company, successor by conversion to SprintCom, Inc., a Kansas corporation, successor by merger to iPCS Wireless, LLC (formerly a corporation) a Delaware limited liability company (Optionee/Lessee/Tenant") and the City of Carroll, Iowa ("Optionor/Lessor/Landlord"), as amended by the First Amendment to Water Tower Attachment Option and Lease Agreement dated May 26, 2015, and Second Amendment to Water Tower Attachment Option and Lease Agreement dated September 27, 2018 (the "Agreement")

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS, Landlord owns certain property consisting of, among other things, a water tower ("Tower") located in the City of Carroll, Carroll County, Iowa; and,

WHEREAS, Landlord and Tenant entered into the Agreement to provide Tenant attachment locations upon the Tower and ground space for Tenant's cellular common carrier mobile radio base station operations, including related telecommunication functions; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to document Tenant's intended changes ("Modifications") to equipment at said Site.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms of this Amendment and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Landlord and Tenant agree as follows:

- 1. Within thirty (30) days after full execution of this Third Amendment, Tenant shall pay to Landlord the sums below:
- a. Three Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty and 00/100 Dollars (\$3,850.00) for structural analysis of the Tower to accommodate Tenant's equipment included in this Third Amendment.
- 2. Use. Paragraph 2 of the II. Lease Agreement, as amended, is further amended by deleting Exhibit B-1 and replacing with the attached Exhibit B-2.
- 3. Use. Paragraph 2 of the II. Lease Agreement, as amended, is further amended by adding the following:
- (a) Equipment shall not block ease of access to the Tower or any access hatch to the interior of the tank,
- (b) No welding is permitted on the Tower tank unless approved by Landlord on an individual case-by-case basis.

- (c) Welding or other work that damages the interior or exterior coatings shall be repaired as follows:
- (1) Affected areas shall be power tool cleaned to bare metal according to SSPC-SP11. Adherent adjacent coatings shall be feather edged around the damage area a minimum of three inches in all directions. Repair coatings shall be as follows:
- ((a)) Interior: Prime coat of Themec Series 91-H₂O HydroZinc at 2.5 to 3.5 dry mils. Stripe coat, as needed, Themec Series N140 Pota-Pox Plus at 5.0 to 7.0 dry mils. Finish coat Themec Series 141 Epoxoline at 14.0 to 17.0 dry mils. Finish coat color shall match the existing tank interior finish coat color.
- ((b)) Exterior: Prime coat of Themec Series 91-H₂O HydroZinc at 2.5 to 3.5 dry mils. Intermediate coat of Themec Series 73 Endura-Shield at 3.0 to 4.0 dry mils. Finish coat of Themec Series 700 Hydroflon at 2.5 to 3.5 dry mils. Finish coat color shall match the existing tank exterior finish coat color.
- 4. Consideration. Paragraph 5 of the II. Lease Agreement, as amended, is further amended as follows:

Effective March 1, 2022, the Rent shall be paid in equal monthly installments of Two Thousand One Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$2,100.00) and shall continue during the term (until changed as set forth herein), partial months to be prorated, in advance. Thereafter, the monthly Rent for each Additional Renewal Term will be increased on the commencement of each Additional Renewal Term by Five Hundred and 00/100 Dollars.

5. Notices. Paragraph 16 of the II. Lease Agreement is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

"All notices, requests, demands or other communications with respect to the Agreement, whether or not herein expressly provided for, must be in writing and will be deemed to have been delivered upon receipt or refusal to accept delivery after being either mailed by United States first-class certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested or deposited with an overnight courier service for next-day delivery to the parties at the following addresses (the addresses may be changed by either party by giving written notice).

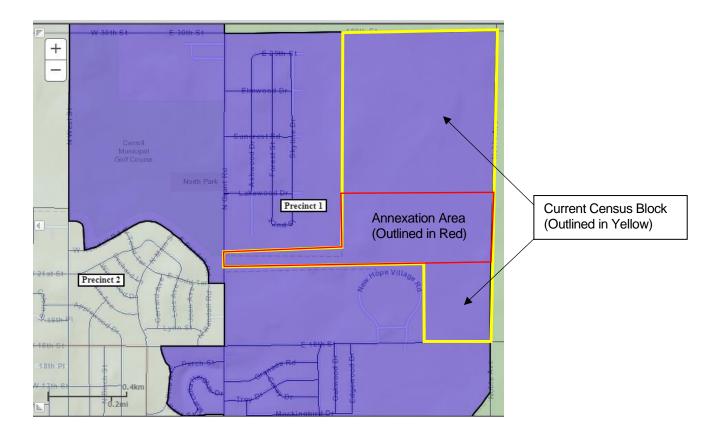
SUBJECT: Ordinance Amending Provisions Pertaining to Voting Precincts -2^{nd} Reading

At the February 14 Council meeting, Council approved an amended agreement with the county to allow an unincorporated area of Carroll County north of E 18th Street between Grant Road and Noble Avenue to part of Voting Precinct 1. Also, at that same meeting, Council approved the first reading of an ordinance to amend the City's Code pertaining to voting precincts.

BACKGROUND

On September 13, 2021, Council approved the annexation of 111 acres of land that was situated in unincorporated Carroll County north of E 18th Street between Grant Road and Noble Avenue on the northeast side of Carroll. Since this annexation was completed after the 2020 census blocks were created, the annexed area splits that census block it is located in in-half. Census blocks form together to create voting precincts. According to Iowa law, you cannot split census blocks for voting purposes. When the annexed area is developed in the future, those future residents would be part of Ward 1 voting in Precinct 1. Since census blocks cannot be split, the county is requesting the remaining area of that census block of the unincorporated area to be able to vote in Precinct 1.

The affected area is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CARROLL, IOWA, 2011, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO VOTING PRECINCTS

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Carroll, Iowa:

SECTION 1. Chapter 3, Section 02, Subsection 1, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Carroll, Iowa, 2011, is repealed and the following is adopted in lieu thereof:

1. Precinct One: Boundaries Correspond with Ward 1 (incorporated territory) and that part of Grant Township, shall include all of the unincorporated area of Grant Township that is South of 180th Street and West of Noble Avenue and North of 190th Street and West of Noble Avenue and all that part of the City of Carroll lying, for the most part, north and east of the following described lines: Beginning at the northern corporate limits, located approximately eleven hundred seventy-two feet north of the intersection of North West Street and Thirtieth Street; thence southerly along the center of corporate limits and all described streets to the centerline of Fairway Heights; thence easterly and southerly to the centerline of Randall Road: thence easterly to the second centerline of Todd Terrace; thence easterly to the centerline of Grant Road; thence southerly to the centerline of Eighteenth Street; thence westerly to the centerline of Pike Avenue; thence southerly to the centerline of Bass Street; thence easterly to the centerline of Grant Road; thence southerly to the centerline of Twelfth Street; thence westerly to the centerline of Clark Street; thence southerly to the centerline of Eleventh Street; thence easterly to the centerline of Forest Street; thence southerly to the centerline of Woodland Drive; thence easterly to the centerline of Bella Vista Drive; thence southerly to the center of U.S. Highway 30; thence easterly to the east corporate line. SUBJECT: Carroll Recreation Center Building Improvement Project – 2021

On February 1st, the City of Carroll received and opened bids for the Carroll Recreation Center Building Improvements Project and considered the project at their February 14th meeting. This memo will provide an overview on the bids, review actions from the February 14th meeting, and provide alternatives to the project, including one that has not previously been discussed, that could be considered by the Council.

The lowest responsive bid was from Badding Construction, reported below:

Based on the estimated cost and the current funding, the project is short \$1,338,000.00.

FEBRUARY 14, 2022 COUNCIL ACTIONS

At the February 14th meeting, the City Council discussed and voted on three motions on the project as follows:

- Approve a resolution to award a construction contract to Badding Construction for the base bid and alternate 1 in the amount of \$7,935,000.00. Motion failed 3-3.
- Approved a motion to rebid HVAC, locker rooms, wet classroom and corridor renovations for the Carroll Recreation Center Improvement Project 2021. Motion failed 3-3.
- Approve a resolution to award a construction contract to Badding Construction for the base bid and alternate 1 and to value engineer the project to find cost savings. Motion failed 3-3.

Since no majority of the Council was reached and with bids remaining valid for 30 days, this continues to be an agenda item for further consideration.

PROJECT OPTIONS

The following options could be considered by the City Council:

1. Proceed with full project

• The overall project cost based on actual bids is \$8,965,000.00 with available funding short \$1,338,000 before any value engineering process.

2. Proceed forward without west side fitness rooms

• The overall project cost based on actual bids is \$8,720,000.00 with available funding short \$1,093,000 before any value engineering process.

3. Scale back and rebid only the HVAC and locker room components of the project

- Based on the bids and using previous estimates from May of 2021, RDG estimated the overall project cost for the HVAC and locker room components to be \$4,268,500. The project would be overfunded by \$3,358,500.
- 4. Don't proceed with renovation at the Carroll Recreation Center at this time

ADDITIONAL ALTERNATIVE

After the meeting on February 14th, the Mayor and City Manager met with RDG to discuss the project and explore various options related to the project. The main aim was to research ways to lower the cost of the project. One option discussed was to add a raised walking/running track within the current gym and forgo the additional third gym. Since the meeting, staff from RDG completed a review of this option and found it would be possible to do this.

RDG has suggested an option that could be considered in rebidding the project with a 'Base Bid' of HVAC replacement along with renovations to the locker room, corridor area, and the addition of a wet classroom. The project could also have an 'Add Alternate' of a jogging/walking track at second level inside the existing gym along the east and west sides, taking over mechanical space at the south, and a small north addition with storage underneath. The details of this option are as follows:

- 1. The option below would be the 'Base-Bid':
 - a. Locker Room Renovations with a total of 4 family changing rooms
 - b. Corridor Improvements Front Desk, new openings into existing gym
 - c. Addition of the wet classroom
 - d. HVAC replacement
 - i. Includes adding AC in existing gym, no other finishes or lighting improvements
 - e. Addresses existing sewer pipe/utility replacement
 - f. Overall construction cost estimate for 'Base-Bid' = \$3,400,000
 - g. <u>Design Fee is as follows: \$28,000, to prepare 'Base Bid' drawings and specifications for re-bidding.</u>
- 2. The option below would be the "Add-Alternate":
 - a. Add jogging/walking track at second level inside existing gym along the east and west side, taking over mechanical space at the south, and a small north addition with storage underneath.
 - i. North addition would be brick at the first level and metal stud with metal panel at the second level to reduce the height of the masonry.
 - b. Includes new lighting and finishes in the existing gym, as previously shown.
 - c. Includes the addition of an elevator and circulation stair within the existing storage space to the east of the central community space and up through the existing roof to the second level.
 - d. Appropriate site / civil updates small impact to site at the north of existing gym.
 - e. Taking over the existing mechanical space for the new track necessitates the following:
 - i. Relocation of existing electrical gear \$100,000
 - ii. New pool unit outside on roof \$450,000 (Current unit is old and our engineer estimates it will need replacing within the next 3-5 years anyways)
 - 1. New pool unit would supply heating and cooling. The existing unit only supplies heat to the pool area.
 - iii. Added structure / reinforcement at roof for pool unit \$50,000
 - iv. Overall construction cost estimate for 'Add-Alternate' = \$2,200,000
 - f. Design Fee is as follows: \$48,000, to prepare 'Add-Alternate' drawings and specifications for re-bidding
 - g. Attached is the concept for adding the second level jogging track, north storage addition, and elevator / stair circulation.

LOST ANNUAL DEBT PAYMENTS

City staff has worked with staff from PFM to understand the impact to LOST funding for the project.

- The original project funding called for the use of \$5,735,000 in GO LOST debt. The average debt service for this amount over 20 years would be \$379,000 per year.
- To complete the full project and use LOST fund to cover the additional cost a total of \$7,725,000 in GO LOST debt would be needed. The average debt service for this amount over 20 years would be \$454,000 per year.
- For a revised project of just a 'Base Bid' of HVAC replacement along with renovations to the locker room, corridor area, and the addition of a wet classroom a total of \$2,596,000 in GO LOST debt would be needed. The average debt service for this amount over 20 years would be \$180,000 per year.
- For a revised project of the above 'Base Bid' and the 'Add Alternate' of a jogging/walking track at second level inside the existing gym along the east and west sides, taking over mechanical space at the south, and a small north addition with storage underneath a total of \$4,954,000 in GO LOST debt would be needed. The average debt service for this amount over 20 years would be \$340,000 per year.

ADDITIONAL POSSIBLE FUNDING SOURCES

If the Council would choose to move forward with this project, there are several funding sources the Council could consider using to cover the short fall. None of these options would create a property tax increase. One or more of these could be selected to cover the short fall, including:

- Issue additional LOST bonding, up to an additional \$1,990,000 could be issued.
 - O Issuing an additional \$1,338,000 in LOST bonding to cover the short fall would increase the projected annual LOST debt payment from approximately \$379,000 annually to approximately \$454,000 annually. After the annual \$454,000 LOST debt payment, committing 25% in LOST being used for property tax relief, putting \$500,000 toward road projects and putting \$150,000 for trails project, annually approximately \$324,000 will remain in LOST funds for other projects.
- Use American Rescue Plan Act funds, up to \$1,470,260 is available.
- Delay or remove FY 2024 Outdoor Aquatic Slide in LOST in the amount of \$425,000.
- Remove trail funding in FY 2023 and FY 2024 as follows:
 - o FY 2023 \$150.000 LOST
 - o FY 2024 \$150,000 LOST
 - o FY 2023 \$100,000 Hotel/Motel
 - o FY 2024 \$100,000 Hotel/Motel

VALUE ENGINEERING

There has been some discussion on value engineering related to this project. As a quick recap, if the City would choose to move forward, they could consider looking at various ways to reduce the construction cost of the project through a value engineering process. A few areas need to be kept in mind if the City would move into a value engineering process.

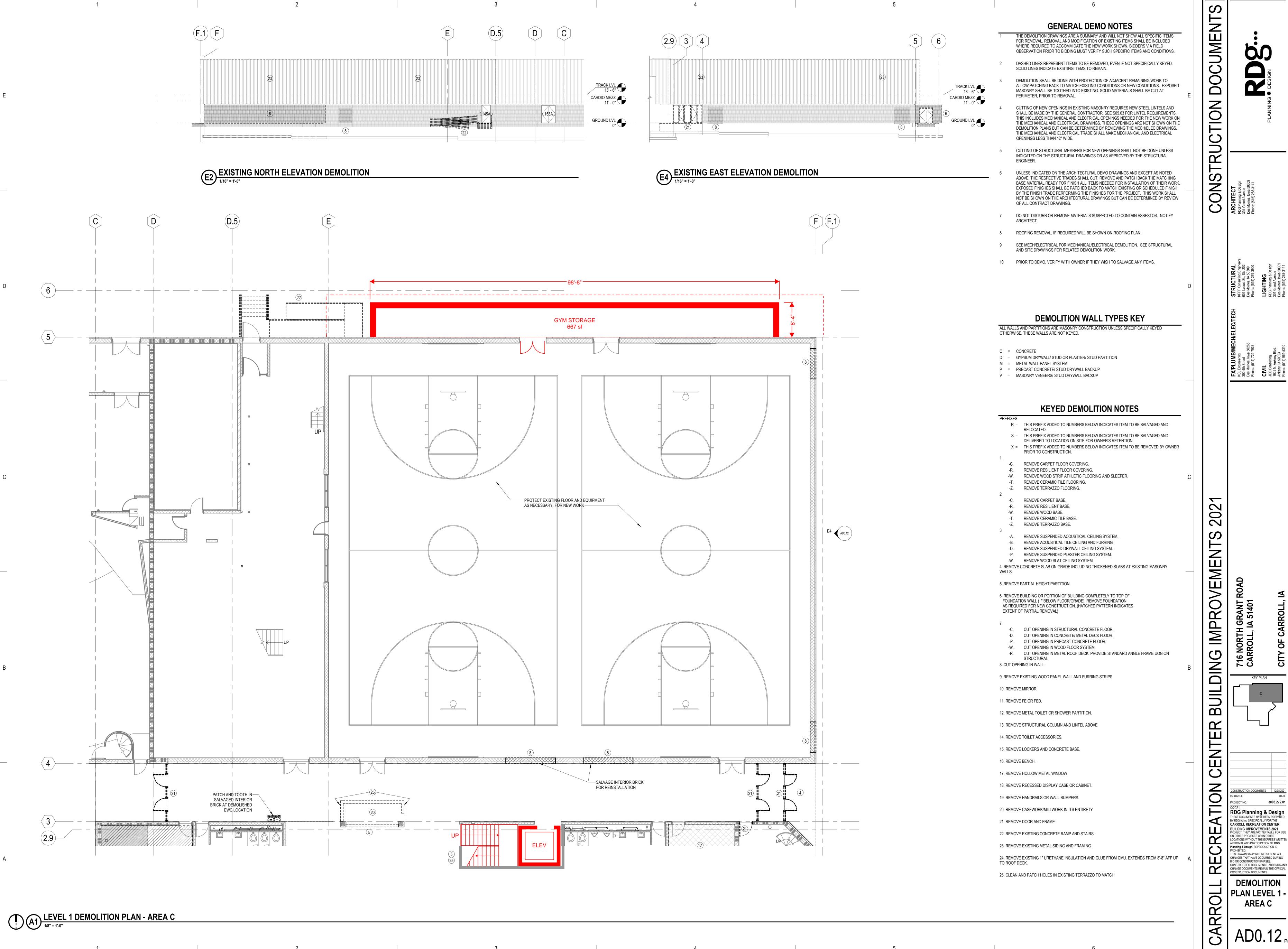
- While there has been discussion about savings the value engineering process has achieved for other projects, there is NO guarantee these levels of savings could be achieved on this project. If the Council would decide to move forward with the project and take on a value engineering process, the City would first be required to approve a contract for the project based on the current bid price. Then the City, architect, and contractor would work together and identify possible areas where savings could be achieved. The City would then need to decide which cost saving options to move forward with. Once these are selected a change order with the reduction would be presented to the Council for final approval.
- Some products that were selected for the project may have a higher upfront cost but require less maintenance or have been found to be more durable over the long term. Take, for example, the new gym floor. Through the design process, a mondo flooring system was selected over a wood floor system. While a wood floor system is less expense to install on the front end, it requires ongoing maintenance every 3 to 5 years where the mondo flooring requires very little maintenance over its 20-year life. Care should be taken when materials are selected that don't unreasonably increase costs over the long term.

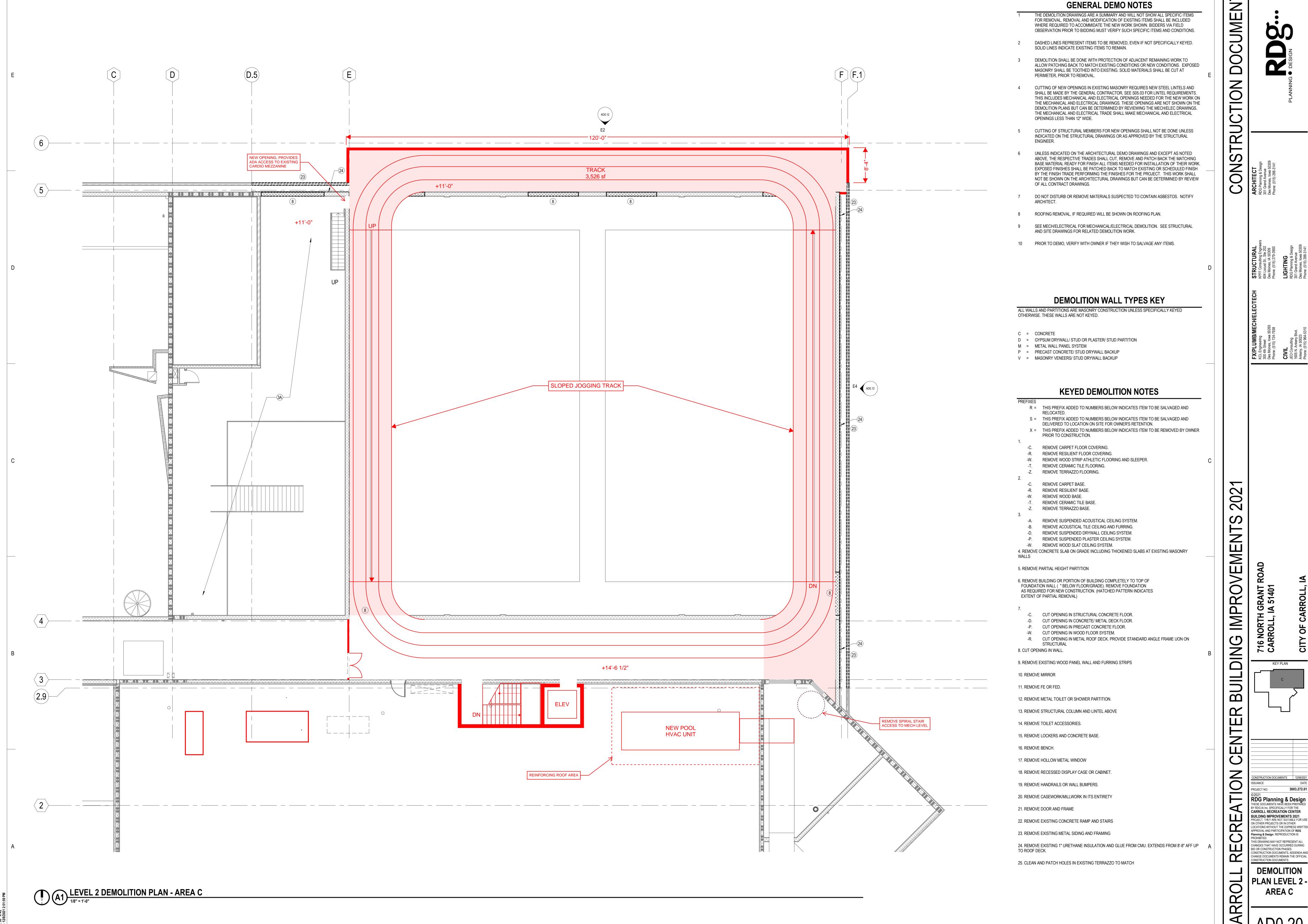

A. Public Hearing

B. Resolution Approving the FY 2022/2023 Maximum Property Tax Dollars

In 2019, the State legislators passed Senate File 634 (SF634). SF 634 was approved with the aim of adding transparency to city and county property taxes. This legislation does two main things. First, it adds additional public notification about city and county property tax collections and an additional public hearing. Second, it requires budgets to be approved by a 2/3 supermajority when property tax collections, in certain categories, exceed 2% over the previous year tax collections.

The new required public notice will only report part of the property taxes collected by the City. Notably the debt service levy is excluded from the required public hearing notices. The levies impacted by the 2% threshold in Carroll's budget proposal are the regular general (\$8.10), tort liability, and employee benefits levies. While the public hearing notice shows an increase of the total tax levy of 1.88% (\$104,910) due to the debt service levy being excluded, the actual total tax levy increase, when including the debt service levy, is 3.09%, or \$193,838 from FY 2021/2022.

The attached Notice of Public Hearing – Proposed Property Tax Levy was published on Friday, February 18, 2022 and posted on all the City's social media sites, as required by the new law.

A public hearing needs to be conducted and Council needs to take action on a resolution approving the FY 2022/2023 maximum property tax dollars. A motion could be made during this discussion to only decrease the maximum property tax dollars and the resolution would be updated to reflect an approved change. The attached resolution has been prepared based upon the notice of public hearing that was published.

A public hearing and approved resolution for the maximum property tax levy is required before setting a public hearing on the entire FY 2022/2023 budget.

The FY 2023 budget proposal contains a debt issuance for a street improvement project and partial funding for the Rec Center project. The debt issuance for the street project is an essential corporate purpose while the debt issuance for the Rec Center project is general corporate purpose. That means there are separate parts of the Iowa Code that would be followed for the public hearing process for each of these debt issuances. Since the scope for the Rec Center project has not been determined yet, staff is recommending proceeding forward with the debt issuance of a street improvement project only at this time. A public hearing for a debt issuance for the Rec Center project can be held at a later time.

The FY 2023 budget also includes an estimate of principal and interest to be repaid and incorporated into the proposed FY 2023 tax levy. In order to include this tax asking into the FY 2023 tax levy, a public hearing needs to be conducted and a pre-levy resolution approved prior to adopting the FY 2023 budget.

The pre-levy resolution tells the public that the City has a need for tax money to pay for debt service (principal and interest) for specific projects from debt to be sold at a later date. The pre-levy resolution gives the basis for the debt service to be included in the FY 2023 budget. The current proposed FY 2023 levy incorporates a repayment amount (principal and interest) of \$349,568 for this debt issuance.

Attached is a resolution to set a public hearing to issue the debt. The proposed date for public hearing is the next regularly scheduled Council meeting of March 14, 2022. If you have any questions, please call me or stop by City Hall.

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and advisable that the City of Carroll, State of Iowa, should provide for the authorization of a Loan Agreement and issuance of General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, to the amount of not to exceed \$2,650,000, as authorized by Sections 384.24A and 384.25, of the Code of Iowa, for the purpose of providing funds to pay costs of carrying out essential corporate purpose project(s) as hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, the Loan Agreement and Notes shall be payable from the Debt Service Fund; and

WHEREAS, before a Loan Agreement may be authorized and General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, issued to evidence the obligation of the City thereunder, it is necessary to comply with the provisions of the Code of Iowa, as amended, and to publish a notice of the proposal and of the time and place of the meeting at which the Council proposes to take action for the authorization of the Loan Agreement and Notes and to receive oral and/or written objections from any resident or property owner of the City to such action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF CITY OF CARROLL, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. That this Council meet in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 627 N. Adams Street, Carroll, Iowa, at 5:15 P.M., on the 14th day of March, 2022, for the purpose of taking action on the matter of the authorization of a Loan Agreement and issuance of not to exceed \$2,650,000 General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, for essential corporate purposes, the proceeds of which notes will be used to provide funds to pay the costs of the opening, widening, extending, grading, and draining of the right-of-way of streets, highways, avenues, alleys and public grounds; the construction, reconstruction, and repairing of any street or bridge improvements; the acquisition, installation, and repair of sidewalks, pedestrian overpasses and underpasses, trails, storm sewers, sanitary sewers, water service lines, street lighting, and traffic control devices, and the acquisition of any real estate needed for any of the foregoing purposes.

Section 2. To the extent any of the projects or activities described in this resolution may be reasonably construed to be included in more than one classification under Subchapter III of Chapter 384 of the Code of Iowa, the Council hereby elects the "essential corporate purpose" classification and procedure with respect to each such project or activity, pursuant to Section 384.28 of the Code of Iowa.

Section 3. The Clerk is authorized and directed to proceed on behalf of the City with the negotiation of terms of a Loan Agreement and the issuance of General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, evidencing the City's obligations to a principal amount of not to exceed \$2,650,000, to select a date for the final approval thereof, to cause to be prepared such notice and sale information as may appear appropriate, to publish and distribute the same on behalf of the City and this Council and otherwise to take all action necessary to permit the completion of a loan on a basis favorable to the City and acceptable to the Council.

Section 4. That the Clerk is hereby directed to cause at least one publication to be made of a notice of the meeting, in a legal newspaper, printed wholly in the English language, published at least once weekly, and having general circulation in the City. The publication to be not less than four clear days nor more than twenty days before the date of the public meeting on the issuance of the Notes.

SUBJECT: FY 2022/2023 Budget – Set Public Hearing Date

Since Fall 2021, City staff has been preparing the FY 2022/2023 proposed budget. In January/February 2022, Council held work sessions on the proposed budget.

A new requirement for the budget adoption process is to hold a public hearing and adopt a resolution approving the maximum property tax dollars. Once that step has been completed, Council may proceed to set a public hearing date for the FY 2022/2023 budget. If there is a change made during the maximum property tax dollars discussion, the change would be reflected in the budget before the notice of public hearing would be published.

Attached is a copy of the State of Iowa budget forms that includes the public hearing notice to be published in the Carroll Times Herald no later than Friday, March 4, 2022 for a public hearing date of March 14, 2022. The state budget forms and notice of public hearing have been prepared based upon the discussions held during the budget work sessions.

The public hearing notice summarizes the actual revenues and expenses for FY 2021, re-estimated revenues and expenses for FY 2022, and proposed FY 2023 revenues and expenses as well as the proposed tax levy (\$12.14382) for FY 2023. Once the public hearing date is set, the maximum expense amounts and tax levy for FY 2023 will also be set. If there are any increases to the budget, those changes would need to be approved prior to setting the public hearing date. A decrease to the budget can be approved at the budget public hearing, prior to approval.

RECOMMENDATION: Council consideration and approval of the proposed FY 2022/2023 budget which includes setting March 14, 2022 as the date for a public hearing for the proposed FY 2022/2023 budget and directs the City Clerk to publish said public hearing notice.

SUBJECT: Discussion Item: Rezac Annexation Request

James A Rezac and Amanda M Rezac owners of Choice Auto have approached the City about extending sanitary sewer to their property at 23296 US Highway 30, shown as property #1 on the attached map. In fact, the City is currently working on plans to extend a sanitary sewer main to the property. Since their property is not within the City of Carroll Corporate Limits, staff has indicated that the Rezac's would need to be annexed into the City before sanitary sewer would be provided.

In a voluntary annexation, Iowa Code Section 368.7(1)(a) permits a City to include up to 20% of the territory without the consent of the property owner of the territory involved to avoid the creation of islands or to make more uniform boundaries. In this case, if the Choice Auto property is annexed, APQS, LLC, shown as property #2 on the attached map, located northeast of Choice Auto could be considered for annexation to make a more uniform boundary. If the APQS, LLC property would be added to this annexation, they would represent 9.5% of the overall annexation area.

To make a more uniform boundary for the City, staff would suggest that the City add the APQS, LLC property to the Choice Auto annexation request. Before staff proceeds with starting the annexation process, the Council is requested to review, discuss, and provide direction on how to proceed.

RECOMMENDATION: Discuss including the APQS, LLC property in the Choice Auto voluntary annexation request.
