COUNCIL MEETING

MARCH 14, 2022

The meeting was held in-person, telephonically or via Zoom web conferencing for those individuals who wished to attend remotely. The public was able to hear and participate in the Council meeting by calling into a publicly posted phone number.

The Carroll City Council met in regular session on this date at 5:15 p.m. in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 627 N Adams Street. Council Members present: Kyle Bauer, Misty Boes, Tom Bordenaro, LaVern Dirkx, JJ Schreck, and Carolyn Siemann. Absent: None. Mayor Mark Beardmore presided and City Attorney Dave Bruner was in attendance.

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The Pledge of Allegiance was led by the City Council. No Council action taken.

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It was moved by Boes, seconded by Bauer, to approve the following items on the consent agenda: a) minutes of the February 28, 2022 Council meeting, as written; b) bills and claims in the amount of \$443,670.71; and c) Renewal of Class "C" Beer Permit with Sunday Sales – *Sparky's One Stop*, Renewal of Class "C" Beer Permit – *Carroll Can Redemption*, and New Class "E" Liquor License with Sunday Sales – *Kimmes Carroll Country Store #1*. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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There were no oral requests or communication from the audience.

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It was moved by Boes, seconded by Siemann, to approve Resolution No. 22-13, Amendment #01 in the amount of \$29,900.00 to the Standard Form of Agreement with RDG Planning & Design for Professional Services for the Carroll Recreation Building Improvements Project – 2021. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Siemann, seconded by Bauer, to approve Resolution No. 22-14, Amendment #02 in the amount of \$58,000.00 to the Standard Form of Agreement with RDG Planning & Design for Professional Services for the Carroll Recreation Building Improvements Project – 2021. This also includes adding bid alternates for ADA accessibility for the weight room and renovations for the west fitness rooms. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried. It was moved by Bauer, seconded by Siemann, to approve Resolution No. 22-15, Merchants Park Lease Agreement Between the City of Carroll and Iowa High School Athletic Association to hold the State Baseball Tournament for Class 1A and 2A for 2022, 2023 and 2024. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Siemann, seconded by Schreck, to approve Resolution No. 22-16, Adult Softball Field Lease Agreement Between the City of Carroll and Kuemper Catholic School System for the 2022 softball season. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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At 5:39 p.m. Mayor Beardmore opened a public hearing on the authorization of a Loan Agreement and the issuance of Notes to evidence the obligation of the City thereunder. Randy Toft, Carroll, Iowa, addressed Council on this issue. Mayor Beardmore closed said public hearing at 5:45 p.m.

It was moved by Schreck, seconded by Bauer, to approve Resolution No. 22-17, Instituting Proceedings to Take Additional Action for the Issuance of Not to Exceed \$2,650,000 General Obligation Capital Loan Notes. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Siemann, seconded Bauer, to approve Resolution No. 22-18, Authorizing the Issuance of General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, Series 2022, and Levying a Tax for the Payment Thereof. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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At 5:47 p.m. Mayor Beardmore opened a public hearing on the FY 2022/2023 Budget. Jeff Cayler, Carroll, Iowa, addressed Council on this issue. Mayor Beardmore closed said hearing at 5:55 p.m.

It was moved by Dirkx, seconded by Bauer, to approve Resolution No. 22-19, Adopting the Annual Budget for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2023. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Dirkx, seconded by Bauer, to approve Resolution No. 22-20, Setting Salaries/Wages for Employees of the City of Carroll for the Fiscal Year 2022/2023. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Bauer, seconded by Bordenaro, to continue the Adams Street Reconstruction development with rescheduling bid letting and construction to 2023. Randy Toft, Carroll, Iowa, addressed Council on this issue. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Bordenaro, seconded by Schreck, to approve the purchase of a pickup truck for the Wastewater Division from New Way Ford at their proposed net price of \$21,740.00. On roll call, Ayes: Boes, Bordenaro, Dirkx, Schreck and Siemann. Abstain due to a conflict of interest: Boes. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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It was moved by Bordenaro, seconded by Bauer, to adjourn at 6:20 p.m. On roll call, all present voted aye. Absent: None. Motion carried.



The Carroll Merchants Baseball Club in the guidance of the Carroll Athletic Association is the requesting the use of the Carroll Merchant Baseball Stadium and the area outside the baseball field (but within the fence) to set up beer ticket and dispensing stands during the Carroll Merchants home baseball games.

The Carroll Merchants regular season will run from last week in May through the first week of August of this year. There will be 21 scheduled home games. In addition, there will be playoff game(s) during the last week of July and the first week of August.

The Merchants Baseball club will create temporary beer ticket and beer dispensing stands during each home Merchant game. (These will be dis-assembled following the game and stored securely until next use.) Only those serving beer will be allowed inside either stand. The location of the respective stands is noted on the map submitted with the license application and notarized signature.

Patrons will be asked to show their ID and those over 21 years of age will be given a wristband. They will be a limited to buying only 2 beers at a time. They will be allowed to consume the beers in the grandstand and on the outside bleachers as shown on the map. Volunteers who work in the beer ticket or beer dispensing area will be asked to complete a state-sanctioned safe-serve program.

A good-faith effort will be made by the baseball club, volunteers, and players to remove all remnants of the beer sales from visibility following each game.

The Carroll Merchants Baseball Club will hold the liquor license and the dram insurance for the beer stand. The Carroll Merchants Baseball Club is registered non-profit organization operating under guidance from the Carroll Athletic Association



FARM LEASE -- CASH RENT

THIS LEASE ("Lease") is made between <u>The City of Carroll (</u>"Landlord"), whose address for the purpose of this Lease is <u>627 N Adams St., Carroll, IA 51401</u>, and <u>The Carroll Area FFA Chapter,</u> <u>Carroll Community High School</u> ("Tenant"), whose address for the purpose of this Lease is <u>Carroll</u> <u>High School</u>, 2809 North Grant Road, Carroll, Iowa 51401.

THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. PREMISES AND TERM. Landlord leases to tenant the following real estate issued in <u>Carroll</u> County, Iowa (the "Real Estate"):

The six cropable acres of Part of Lot 1 of the Irregular Survey of the SE 1/4 SE, 1/4 of Section 25, Township 84 North, Range 35, West PM, Carroll County, Iowa, lying East of the Goetzinger and Steffes 1st Addition, and lying North of the North line of Clark Street, and lying West of the West line of South Grant Road, approximately nine acres.

and subject to county roadway easements and any other easements or restrictions of record. Possession by Tenant to Commence on <u>April 1, 2022</u>, and end on <u>December 31, 2022</u>.

2. RENT. Tenant agrees to pay Landlord as rent for the Real Estate ("the Rent"):

<u>The rent shall be a total of one dollar (\$1.00). All inputs and returns shall be the</u> responsibility of the Tenant.

3. PLANTING OF CROPS. Tenant shall prepare the Real Estate and plant such crops in a timely fashion as may be designated by Landlord.

Tenant shall make available any and all data collected to Landlord.

4. PROPER HUSBANDRY. Tenant agrees to farm the Real Estate in a good and husband like manner, and to seek to obtain the best crop production that the soil and crop season will permit. Tenant shall do what is reasonably necessary to control soil erosion including, but not limited to, the maintenance of existing watercourses, waterways, ditches, drainage areas, terraces and tile drains, and abstain from any practice which will cause damage to the Real Estate.

5. HARVESTING OF CROPS. Tenant agrees to appropriately care for all growing crops in a good and husband like manner, and to harvest all crops in a timely fashion.

6. TERMINATION OF LEASE. This lease shall be terminated on December 31, 2022.

7. POSSESSION AND CONDITION AT END OF TERM. At the termination of this Lease, the Tenant will relinquish possession of the Real Estate to the Landlord.

8. CARE OF SOIL. Tenant agrees to maintain soil fertility at the same or better level as at the time of this Lease.

9. FERTILIZER, LIME AND CHEMICALS. The following materials, in the amounts required by good husbandry, shall be acquired by Tenant and paid for by the parties as follows:

100% Tenant 0% Landlord

11. FARM MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT. All necessary machinery and equipment shall be furnished by the **<u>Tenant</u>**.

12. CARE OF TREES, SHRUBS, AND GRASS. Landlord agrees to maintain all trees, shrubs and grass adjoining the said property.

13. WEED CONTROL. Otherwise, all noxious weeds shall be sprayed or otherwise timely destroyed by the tenant, at the Tenant's expense. Tenant shall timely cut or spray with herbicide, trees in fencerows.

14. LANDLORD'S RIGHT OF ENTRY AND INSPECTION. In the event notice of termination of this Lease has properly been served, landlord reserves the right to enter upon and plow the Real Estate after Tenant has completed the harvest of crops. Landlord may enter for any other reasonable purposes or to make repairs.

The notices contemplated in this Lease shall be made in writing and shall either be delivered in person, or be mailed in the US Mail, Registered Mail, Return Receipt Requested, to the Recipient's last known mailing address. The notice provisions of this Section 23 shall not apply to the notice of termination set forth in Section 6, Termination of Lease. The notice of termination is specifically governed by the Code of Iowa.



The Permit Revision includes a requirement that the City submit, to the DNR, a preliminary engineering report that contains alternative options for maintaining adequate chlorine residuals throughout the distribution system within the northeast area of the City. The Permit requires that the Report be submitted to the DNR by December 31, 2022.

Attached is a proposed Agreement for Professional Services requested and received from JEO Consulting Group, Inc. The Scope of Services is detailed in the Agreement. In summary, the Agreement includes the preparation of a Preliminary Engineering Report that examines low chlorine residuals within the water distribution system and evaluates potential changes to the existing treatment and chlorination system processes to maintain adequate chlorine residuals.

Project Description:

The Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) issued a sanitary survey report on November 23, 2021, requiring the City of Carroll (Owner) to submit a written plan explaining how adequate disinfection residuals will be maintained within the Collision Addition (NE portion of the distribution system). The Owner responded on December 20, 2021, indicating that they would further study the issue of low chlorine residuals. The results of the study are to be shared with the IDNR by December 31, 2022.

JEO to prepare a water system preliminary engineering report (PER) that will review past results/available records and evaluate potential changes to the existing supply, treatment and chlorination system process to address the low chlorine residuals within the distribution system, such as: discontinuing use of high ammonia wells, breakpoint chlorination, installation of chlorine booster systems within the distribution system, ammonia removal treatment systems, water softening, and other potential alternatives not identified currently.

Basic Scope of Services – (Lump Sum):

JEO Consulting Group, Inc. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. SCOPE OF SERVICES: JEO Consulting Group, Inc. (JEO) shall perform the services described in Exhibit A. JEO shall invoice the owner for these services at the fee stated in Exhibit A.

2. ADDITIONAL SERVICES: JEO can perform work beyond the scope of services, as additional services, for a negotiated fee or at fee schedule rates.

3. OWNER RESPONSIBILITIES: The owner shall provide all criteria and full information as to the owner's requirements for the project; designate and identify in writing a person to act with authority on the owner's behalf in respect to all aspects of the project; examine and respond promptly to JEO's submissions; and give prompt written notice to JEO whenever the owner observes or otherwise becomes aware of any defect in work.

Unless otherwise agreed, the owner shall furnish JEO with rightof-access to the site in order to conduct the scope of services. Unless otherwise agreed, the owner shall also secure all necessary permits, approvals, licenses, consents, and property descriptions necessary to the performance of the services hereunder. While JEO shall take reasonable precautions to minimize damage to the property, it is understood by the owner that in the normal course of work some damage may occur, the restoration of which is not a part of this agreement.

4. TIMES FOR RENDERING SERVICES: JEO's services and compensation under this agreement have been agreed to in anticipation of the orderly and continuous progress of the project through completion. Unless specific periods of time or specific dates for providing services are specified in the scope of services, JEO's obligation to render services hereunder shall be for a period which may reasonably be required for the completion of said services.

If specific periods of time for rendering services are set forth or specific dates by which services are to be completed are provided, and if such periods of time or date are changed through no fault of JEO, the rates and amounts of compensation provided for herein shall be subject to equitable adjustment. If the owner has requested changes in the scope, extent, or character of the project, the time of performance of JEO's services shall be adjusted equitably.

5. INVOICES: JEO shall submit invoices to the owner monthly for services provided to date and a final bill upon completion of services. Invoices are due and payable within 30 days of receipt. Invoices are considered past due after 30 days. Owner agrees to pay a finance charge on past due invoices at the rate of 1.0% per month, or the maximum rate of interest permitted by law.

If the owner fails to make any payment due to JEO for services and expenses within 30 days after receipt of JEO's statement, JEO may, after giving 7 days' written notice to the owner, suspend services to the owner under this agreement until JEO has been paid in full all amounts due for services, expenses, and charges.

6. STANDARD OF CARE: The standard of care for all services performed or furnished by JEO under the agreement shall be the care and skill ordinarily used by members of JEO's



profession practicing under similar circumstances at the same time and in the same locality. JEO makes no warranties, express or implied, under this agreement or otherwise, in connection with JEO's services.

JEO shall be responsible for the technical accuracy of its services and documents resulting therefrom, and the owner shall not be responsible for discovering deficiencies therein. JEO shall correct such deficiencies without additional compensation except to the extent such action is directly attributable to deficiencies in owner furnished information.

7. REUSE OF DOCUMENTS: Reuse of any materials (including in part plans, specifications, drawings, reports, designs, computations, computer programs, data, estimates, surveys, other work items, etc.) by the owner on a future extension of this project, or any other project without JEO's written authorization shall be at the owner's risk and the owner agrees to indemnify and hold harmless JEO from all claims, damages, and expenses including attorney's fees arising out of such unauthorized use.

8. ELECTRONIC FILES: Copies of Documents that may be relied upon by the owner are limited to the printed copies (also known as hard copies) that are signed or sealed by JEO. Files in electronic media format of text, data, graphics, or of other types that are furnished by JEO to the owner are only for convenience of the owner. Any conclusion or information obtained or derived from such electronic files shall be at the user's sole risk.

a. Because data stored in electronic media format can deteriorate or be modified inadvertently or otherwise without authorization of the data's creator, the party receiving electronic files agrees that it shall perform acceptance tests or procedures within 30 days, after which the receiving party shall be deemed to have accepted the data thus transferred. Any errors detected within the 30 day acceptance period shall be corrected by the party delivering the electronic files. JEO shall not be responsible to maintain documents stored in electronic media format after acceptance by the owner.

b. When transferring documents in electronic media format, JEO makes no representations as to long term compatibility, usability, or readability of documents resulting from the use of software application packages, operating systems, or computer hardware differing from those used by JEO at the beginning of the project.

c. The owner may make and retain copies of documents for information and reference in connection with use on the project by the owner.

d. If there is a discrepancy between the electronic files and the hard copies, the hard copies govern.

e. Any verification or adaptation of the documents by JEO for extensions of the project or for any other project shall entitle JEO to further compensation at rates to be agreed upon by the owner and JEO.

9. SUBCONSULTANTS: JEO may employ consultants as JEO deems necessary to assist in the performance of the services. JEO shall not be required to employ any consultant unacceptable to JEO.

10. INDEMNIFICATION: To the fullest extent permitted by law, JEO and the owner shall indemnify and hold each other harmless and their respective officers, directors, partners, employees, and consultants from and against any and all claims, losses, damages, and expenses (including but not limited to all fees and charges of engineers, architects, attorneys, and other professionals, and all court or arbitration or other dispute resolution costs) to the extent such claims, losses, damages, or expenses are caused by the indemnifying parties' negligent acts, errors, or omissions. In the event claims, losses, damages, or expenses are caused by the joint or concurrent negligence of JEO and the owner, they shall be borne by each party in proportion to its negligence.

 - i. Each Occurrence: \$1,000,000
 - ii. General Aggregate: \$2,000,000

g. All policies of property insurance shall contain provisions to the effect that JEO and JEO's consultants' interests are covered and that in the event of payment of any loss or damage the insurers shall have no rights of recovery against any of the insureds or additional insureds thereunder.

h. The owner shall require the contractor to purchase and maintain general liability and other insurance as specified in the Contract Documents and to cause JEO and JEO's consultants to be listed as additional insured with respect to such liability and other insurance purchased and maintained by the contractor for the project.

i. The owner shall reimburse JEO for any additional limits or coverages that the owner requires for the project.

12. TERMINATION: This agreement may be terminated by either party upon 7 days prior written notice. In the event of termination, JEO shall be compensated by owner for all services performed up to and including the termination date. The effective date of termination may be set up to thirty (30) days later than otherwise provided to allow JEO to demobilize personnel and equipment from the site, to complete tasks whose value would otherwise be lost, to prepare notes as to the status of completed and uncompleted tasks, and to assemble project materials in orderly files.

13. GOVERNING LAW: This agreement is to be governed by the law of the state in which the project is located.

14. SUCCESSORS, ASSIGNS, AND BENEFICIARIES: The owner and JEO each is hereby bound and the partners, successors, executors, administrators and legal representatives of the owner and JEO are hereby bound to the other party to this agreement and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators and legal representatives (and said assigns) of such other party, with respect to all covenants, agreements and obligations of this agreement.

a. Neither the owner nor JEO may assign, sublet, or transfer any rights under or interest (including, but without limitation, monies that are due or may become due) in this agreement without the written consent of the other, except to the extent that any assignment, subletting, or transfer is mandated or restricted by law. Unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment shall release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this agreement.

b. Unless expressly provided otherwise in this agreement: Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to create, impose, or give rise to any duty owed by the owner or JEO to any contractor, contractor's subcontractor, supplier, other individual or entity, or to any surety for or employee of any of them.

c. All duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this agreement shall be for the sole and exclusive benefit of the owner and JEO and not for the benefit of any other party.

15. PRECEDENCE: These standards, terms, and conditions shall take precedence over any inconsistent or contradictory language contained in any proposal, contract, purchase order, requisition, notice to proceed, or like document regarding JEO's services.

16. SEVERABILITY: Any provision or part of the agreement held to be void or unenforceable shall be deemed stricken, and all remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and binding upon the owner and JEO, who agree that the agreement shall be reformed to replace such stricken provision or part thereof with a valid and enforceable provision that comes as close as possible to expressing the intention of the stricken provision.

17. NON-DISCRIMINATION CLAUSE: Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 73-102, the parties declare, promise, and warrant that they have and will continue to comply fully with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 U.S.C.A § 1985, et seq.) and the Nebraska Fair Employment Practice Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. § 48-1101, et seq., in that there shall be no discrimination against any employee who is employed in the performance of this agreement, or against any applicant for such employment, because of age, color, national origin, race, religion, creed, disability or sex.

18. E-VERIFY: JEO shall register with and use the E-Verify Program, or an equivalent federal program designated by the United States Department of Homeland Security or other federal agency authorized to verify the work eligibility status of a newly hired employee pursuant to the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, to determine the work eligibility status of new employees physically performing services within the state where the work shall be performed. Engineer shall require the same of each consultant.

SUBJECT:	Voluntary Dental Insurance Offering

The City has been considering offering Dental Insurance to its employees over the past year. When the City Personnel Policy was update in September of 2021, the following language was added concerning dental insurance to the policy:

17.5 **Dental Insurance**. The City may elect to offer a voluntary dental insurance plan for its employees. Premiums for dental insurance shall be paid 100% by the employees through payroll deduction.

Other than minor administrative burden to administer this benefit there would be no cost to the City to offer this benefit. Offering such a benefit may also assist the City in recruiting new employees in the current competitive job market.

With the upcoming health insurance open enrollment in June, this would be the time for the City to consider making this benefit available to our employees. Staff received preliminary rates last summer from both Delta Dental and Wellmark Blue Cross Blue Shield when discussions on offering dental insurance first started. While final and updated rates would need to be secured for a July 1, 2022 start, preliminary monthly rates were as follows:

Status of housing in Carroll and options for growing opportunity in Carroll

Mike Pogge-Weaver, City Manger March 28, 2022

Historically low number of houses available

- For the month of February of 2022, just over 7,000 homes were for sale in the Des Moines metro area. That's nearly 14% less than what was available in February of 2021.
- Homes are selling faster and at higher prices. The median sales price in the Des Moines metro area also increased 4.5% from last year.



Des Moines metro cities broke building or construction records

- According to the Des Moines Home Builders Association, the year ended with 3,704 single-family permits issued in the metro, a level not reached since 2005, when 3,996 homes were built in the region.
- It's an 11% increase over 2020 in the 21 central lowa communities the association tracks.
- Issues that limited growth included worker shortage that has sometimes made it difficult to get the supplies and skilled labor needed for construction projects.

Des Moines metro cities broke building or construction records

- Six Des Moines metro cities broke records for the value of building permits issued in 2021, continuing a trend in the fast-growing area even amid the global pandemic.



- Nov 29, 2021 16 homes (0.5%) were on the market.





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





















FINANCING CONSIDERATIONS – PELLA WORKFORCE HOUSING

- Proposed Prairie Ridge development assumes 93 single family homes and 45 townhomes.
 - Projected \$31.6 million of new valuation.
 - Assumed first tax revenues generated in FY 2023-24.
- Related infrastructure costs estimated at \$5.6 million.
 - County assisting with \$4.7 million of this total (City covers the balance).
- County secured G.O. bonding authority for defined urban renewal purposes with simple public hearing process.
 - Debt will initially be repaid by debt service levy tax revenues, but TIF revenues would partially abate payments once available.
- Projected breakeven of approximately \$5.3 million in future tax/TIF revenues.
 - Of which, \$1.6 million would be in the form of LMI funds (can be spent anywhere within Marion County not limited to Pella).

COUNTY-WIDE IMPACT – PELLA WORKFORCE HOUSING

- 'Worst-case' impact to the County (no development valuation created), using the \$4.7 million Prairie Ridge infrastructure cost:
 - Debt service levy impact of approximately \$12.43 per year, per \$100,000 of residential assessed valuation.
 - This would be \$1.04 per month.
- Long-term potential return on investment (ROI) for the County:
 - TIF/tax revenues not limited to term of Urban Renewal (TIF) area.
 - County continues to realize tax revenues going forward.
 - LMI funds \$1.6 million to applied throughout the County for other projects.
 - Growth in total economic spending due to new workforce housing.
 - Additional investment within County due to new workforce housing.
